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1. Introduction

This Copyright and Intellectual Property Policy explains how copyright, intellectual property, platform content, user submissions, third-party materials, open knowledge, and rights complaints are handled on the Ozeon website.

It applies to the current Ozeon public website at <https://ozeon.com> and related pages, forms, early access features, waitlist features, website content, restricted Studio functionality, editor functionality, internal content tools, files, images, documents, and other materials Ozeon may make available. It should be read together with Ozeon's [Terms of Use](#), [Privacy Policy](#), and [Cookie Policy](#).

This policy does not yet fully govern future public platform features such as public user accounts, organisation accounts, payments, project publishing, project funding, subscriptions, article/media/tutorial publishing, bounties, DAO participation, Educational Resources, Progress tokens, \$OZN utility, NFTs, IP-NFTs, OCIS climate intelligence, dMRV monitoring and reports, AI Footprint, project verification workflows, or public platform file and media uploads. Before those features launch publicly, Ozeon may publish additional contributor terms, publication terms, content guidelines, intellectual property terms, copyright procedures, licensing rules, platform rules, or feature-specific agreements.

3. Ozeon-Owned Content

Unless otherwise stated, content on the Ozeon website is owned by Ozeon, licensed to Ozeon, or used with permission. 6. Third-Party Content and Licensed Materials

The Ozeon website may include or refer to third-party content, materials, services, reports, publications, images, icons, software, open-source libraries, fonts, APIs, tools, datasets, links, or resources. Where Ozeon uses third-party materials, it does so under an appropriate licence, permission, legal exception, or attribution basis.

8. User Submissions

The Ozeon website may allow users to submit information, messages, interests, contact details, organisation details, project details, files, images, feedback, or other materials. Future platform features may allow users or organisations to publish articles, media, tutorials, project pages, Educational Resources, Open Calls, bounties, NFTs, IP-NFTs, public uploads, and other content.

- it does not include sensitive personal data unless Ozeon specifically requests it through an appropriate protected process
- it does not include restricted cultural knowledge, sacred knowledge, community-held knowledge, or Indigenous knowledge unless you have the appropriate rights, consent, context, authority, and permission

Ozeon may remove, reject, moderate, edit, restrict, or decline to publish submitted content where necessary to protect the website, comply with law, maintain quality standards, protect rights holders, protect communities, or protect users.

9. Licence Granted to Ozeon for Submitted Content

You retain ownership of any copyright or intellectual property rights you hold in content you submit to Ozeon. This licence does not transfer ownership of your content to Ozeon. If Ozeon wishes to publicly publish, feature, commercialise, sell, license, or otherwise use your submitted content beyond the purposes reasonably connected to your submission, Ozeon will seek your permission or rely on separate contributor, platform, publication, partnership, or feature-specific terms.

Future public publishing features may require additional contributor terms explaining how content is displayed, licensed, monetised, moderated, promoted, stored, removed, attributed, or shared.

10. Moral Rights and Attribution

Where applicable, authors and creators may have moral rights, attribution rights, integrity rights, or similar rights under applicable law. Ozeon respects attribution and authorship where appropriate.

Users must not remove, falsify, obscure, or misrepresent copyright notices, licence information, attribution statements, author names, source references, metadata, or rights-management information. Where content is contributed by researchers, educators, artists, designers, scientists, organisations, communities, or project teams, Ozeon may require appropriate attribution, source links, metadata, references, or licence information.

11. Indigenous Knowledge, Local Knowledge, and Cultural Materials

Ozeon's approach to Indigenous and local knowledge is guided by consent, attribution, custodianship, cultural sensitivity, reciprocity, community review, access control, and knowledge sovereignty.

12. AI-Assisted Content and Copyright

Ozeon may describe or use AI-supported tools as part of current or future platform development. Users remain responsible for ensuring that any AI-assisted content they submit, publish, upload, or use through Ozeon does not infringe copyright, privacy rights, confidentiality obligations, Indigenous knowledge rights, database rights, trade secrets, or other third-party rights.

Users should not submit AI-generated or AI-assisted content that:

- copies protected works without permission
- imitates living artists or identifiable creators in a misleading or infringing way
- includes copyrighted text, images, audio, video, datasets, or media without appropriate rights
- misrepresents authorship or source material
- contains confidential or restricted information
- contains culturally sensitive or restricted knowledge without permission
- violates applicable platform rules, laws, or third-party terms

Future AI-related platform features may require additional AI content rules, disclosure rules, attribution rules, training-data restrictions, or verification procedures.

13. Open-Source Software and Third-Party Code

The website may include or rely on open-source software, third-party libraries, frameworks, APIs, infrastructure services, analytics tools, fonts, and other technical components. These materials may be subject to their own licences, notices, conditions, and restrictions.

Nothing in this policy grants users rights to open-source or third-party materials except where those rights are clearly provided by the relevant licence or rights holder. Ozeon complies with applicable open-source licence obligations and third-party software terms.

14. Unauthorised Use of Ozeon Content

Unless permitted by law or expressly authorised by Ozeon, users must not:

15. Reporting Copyright or Intellectual Property Infringement

If you believe content on the Ozeon website infringes your copyright or intellectual property rights, send a notice to legal@ozeon.com with the subject line "**Copyright / IP Complaint**", including:

- your full name and organisation, if applicable
- your contact email address
- a description of the copyrighted work or protected material
- the URL or location of the allegedly infringing material on Ozeon
- evidence that you own the rights or are authorised to act for the rights holder
- a clear explanation of why you believe the use is unauthorised or infringing
- any relevant registration, publication, licence, attribution, or ownership information
- the action you request — removal, attribution correction, access restriction, or further review
- a statement that the information in your notice is accurate to the best of your knowledge

Ozeon may request additional information where needed to assess the complaint.

16. Ozeon's Response to Complaints

When Ozeon receives a copyright or intellectual property complaint, it may take steps such as acknowledging receipt, reviewing the complaint, requesting additional information, temporarily restricting or removing access to the disputed material, contacting the user or contributor who submitted it, correcting attribution or licence information, restoring content where the complaint appears invalid or resolved, preserving records for legal, security, or dispute-resolution purposes, and referring the matter to legal advisers where appropriate.

Ozeon may act quickly where a complaint appears credible, urgent, legally significant, or connected to sensitive cultural, community, or Indigenous knowledge. Ozeon may decline to act where a complaint is incomplete, abusive, misleading, unsupported, fraudulent, or outside the scope of copyright or intellectual property rights.

17. Disputing a Complaint

If content you submitted has been removed, restricted, or challenged, contact legal@ozeon.com with the subject line "**Copyright / IP Dispute**", including:

- your full name and contact email address
- the content or URL involved
- why you believe you had the right to submit, publish, or use the content

- any relevant licences, permissions, contracts, attribution records, source links, or ownership information
- whether the content was original, licensed, public domain, open access, fair dealing/fair use, permitted by exception, or used with consent
- any other information that may help Ozeon review the dispute

Ozeon may review the dispute, request additional information, maintain the restriction, restore the content, or require the parties to resolve the matter directly.

18. Repeat Infringement and Misuse

Ozeon may restrict, suspend, or terminate access to website features, restricted tools, public publishing features, or future platform accounts where a user repeatedly submits infringing, unlawful, unauthorised, or rights-violating content. Ozeon may also restrict users who repeatedly submit false, abusive, misleading, or bad-faith copyright complaints.

19. Public Domain, Open Access, and Licence Claims

Users must be careful when claiming that content is public domain, open access, Creative Commons licensed, or otherwise free to use. Before submitting or publishing such content, check:

20. Research, Citation, and Fair Use / Fair Dealing

Ozeon supports research, education, commentary, criticism, citation, and open knowledge. However, users remain responsible for ensuring their use of third-party materials is lawful. 22. Project, Research, and Organisation Content
